RRATA.—In lines 1 and 2 of the description of Pukekura Riding of the County of Waipa, published in the Gazette of the 15th June, 1922, pages 1575 and 1576, for "bounded on the north and west" read "bounded on the north and east."

In the ninth and twenty-eighth lines of the Second Schedule to the Proclamation constituting the Hutt Valley Electric-power District, published in New Zealand Gazette No. 53, page 1735, of 6th July, 1922, for "eastern" read "western."

Proclaiming Road-lines laid out through Kaitao-Rotohokahoka Block, Kaitao-Rotohokahoka 11 Block, and Rotohokahoka D South Nos. 2, 3, 7, and 8 Blocks to be Public Roads.

JELLICOE, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the parcels of land described in the Schedule VV hereto were, by orders of the Native Land Court made on the thirtieth day of October and the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and cleven, and the seventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, duly laid out as road-lines, in pursuance of section one hundred and seventeen of the Native Land Act, 1909:

And whereas by section two of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1918, it is provided that where any road-line has heretofore been laid out under the said section one hundred and seventeen and out under the said section one hundred and seventeen and has not been proclaimed as a public road, then such road-line may be proclaimed as a public road under section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, subject, however, to the conditions prescribed by section fifty-one of the last-mentioned Act and section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas que month's notice in writing of the intention

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-lines as public roads has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned, in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-lines

should be proclaimed as public roads:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe,
Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, do hereby proclaim as public roads the road-lines described in the Schedule hereto.
