Defining River, Extended-river, and Extreme Limits.

Marine Department, Wellington, 18th August, 1922. I N pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 189 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, I, George James Anderson, Minister of Marine, do hereby define the limits, for the ports set forth in the first column of the Schedule hereto, within which restricted-limit steamships, and ships propelled by gas, oil, fluid, electricity, or any mechanical power other than steam, and to which restricted-limit certificates are issued, may ply, to be those set forth in the second, third, and fourth columns of the said Schedule respectively, and I do divide such limits into river, extendedriver, and extreme limits respectively ; and I do also hereby revoke all Warrants heretofore in force defining any of the said limits.
