In the application to such works of section 32 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act wherever that expression occurs in subsection (1) (a) and for the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in subsection (1) (b).
