*Special Order in re Noxious Weeds.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in it in that behalf by sections 4 and 5 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, and section 2 of the Amending Act of 1910, and all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling, the Inglewood County Council hereby resolves by way of special order as follows:—

That the Inglewood County Council hereby declares the following plants (which appear in the Third Schedule to the Act of 1908) to be noxious weeds within the areas of jurisdiction,—

Broom (*Cytisus scoparius*).  
Foxglove (*Digitalis purpurea*).  
Gorse (*Ulex europæus*).  
Ox-eye daisy (*Chrysanthemum leucanthemum*).  
Pennyroyal (*Mentha pulegium*).  
St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum* or *H. humifusum*).  
Spiderwort (*Leycesteria formosa*).  
Barberry (*Berberis vulgaris*).
