Auckland Harbour.-Dredge at Work.

Marine Department, Wellington, N.Z., 24th April, 1923. THE Auckland Harbour Board notify that the dredger "Hapai" is now moored at a position six hundred feet (approximately) north-west of the north-western corner of Prince's Wheet

of Prince's Wharf. The dredger, which is moored cardinally, is intended to work in an easterly and south-easterly direction.

Botween sunset and surfise the dredger will exhibit re-gulation anchor lights, and in addition will exhibit from amidships on the channel side one all-round red light.
