#### A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation dated the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 11, of the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, taking land for street purposes in the City of Wellington, as affects the land described in the Schedule hereto, such land being no longer required for the purpose for which it was taken.

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land not required: 2 roods 7 perches.

Being portion of Section 6, Harbour District, and closed road.
