WHEREAS the Governor-General is satisfied that the population of the Opunake Town District, in the County of Egmont, exceeds five hundred, and the Town Board of the said Opunake Town District has made appli-

cation that the said town district shall not form part of the County of Egmont, being the county within the boundaries of which is it situated :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Town Boards Amendment Act, 1908 (No. 2), and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that, on and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the Opunake Town District shall not form part of the County of Egmont.
