# UPPER CLUTHA RACING CLUB.

# REGULATIONS.

# (Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

N pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Upper Clutha Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Hawea Domain situated in the district of Hawea Flat, and known as the Upper Clutha Racing Club Racecourse, while the said race-course is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings. 1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of

1. These regulations shall come into ince on the date of the target of the same being published in the New Zealand Gazette. 2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely :-

- (a.) Bookmakers.
  (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Con-ference, the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d.) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually con-sort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or pos-sessing counterfeit, coin, theft, false pretences, re-ceiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act. 1908, vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted

of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908. Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Com-mittee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and other-wise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

# CITY OF AUCKLAND.

THE following resolution was passed at a meeting of the Auckland City Council held on the 29th day of November, 1923 :
