ALL that portion of the Ongarue Stream Road commencing at the Ongarue Stream at a point in Rangitoto-Tuhua Section 78B 2c East, Block VIII, Ongarue Survey District, and proceeding thence generally in an easterly and then north-easterly direction adjoining or passing through the said
