RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Picton Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, sinking fund, and other charges on the Picton Borough Electrical Installation Loan of £6,600, 1924, authorized to be raised by the Picton Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of (a) installing an 80 k.w. electrical power plant and reticulation, £5,600; (b) installing meters, £1,000; the said Picton Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of seven-eighths (7/8ths) of a penny in the pound sterling on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the whole of the Borough of Picton; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of January in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and a half years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

RESOLUTION INCREASING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf the Local Bodies' Loan Act, 1913, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Picton Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, sinking fund, and other charges on the Picton Borough Electrical Installation Loan of £6,600, 1924, authorized to be raised by the Picton Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of (a) installing an 80 k.w. electrical power plant and reticulation, £5,600; (b) installing meters, £1,000; the said Council, pursuant to section 22 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, hereby increases to nineteenth-twentieths (19/20ths) of a penny in the pound sterling the special rate of seven-eighths (7/8ths) of a penny in the pound sterling made and levied by resolution passed by the said Council on the 13th day of March, 1924, on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the whole of the Borough of Picton, such rate of seven-eighths (7/8ths) of a penny in the pound sterling being insufficient to provide for payment of interest and sinking fund and other charges on such loan; and that such special rate as increased shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of January in each

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Marton Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—
