**GISBORNE LAND REGISTRATION DISTRICT.**

Station; thence along the south-western boundaries of Marataha No. 2 and Maraetaha No. 2c Blocks and of Okahu Block to the western boundary of Paritu Block; thence along that boundary and the northern boundaries of Paritu No. 2 and Takararoa Blocks to the sea at Ngakau-o-te-Paritu; thence generally northerly and westerly along the sea-coast to the middle of the entrance to the Ohiwa Harbour, the point of commencement; including all adjacent islands and including also such parts of the bed of the sea adjacent to such sea-coast aforesaid as may from time to time be comprised in any certificate of title that may have been issued or may be issued in future in accordance with any sufficient authority.

**HAWKE'S BAY LAND REGISTRATION DISTRICT.**

Bounded towards the east generally by the sea; towards the south generally by a line along the middle of the Waimata Stream and the south-western boundary-line of Section 1, Block XIII, Tautane Survey District, to Trig.
