ROTORUA COUNTY COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the County of Rotorua, taken on the 8th day of August, 1924, on a proposal to borrow the sum of £40,000 for the purpose of providing the necessary machinery and plant, and for forming, improving, metalling, or surfacing various roads within the County of Rotorua, as scheduled in the notices previously advertised, the number of valid votes recorded for the proposal was 195, while the number of valid votes recorded against the proposal was 84.
