In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and the Local Bodies' Finance Act, 1921-22, the Waitomo County Council hereby resolves as follows:

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £17,800, authorized to be raised by the Waitomo County Council under the above-mentioned Acts, for the purpose of paying off part of the antecedent liahility of that portion of the new Waitomo County which was originally part of the old Waitomo County, the said Waitomo

County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-fifth of a penny in the pound upon the unimproved rateable value of all rateable property of the Antecedent Liability Special-rating District, comprising the following ridings of the County of Waitomo—Aria, Hangatiki, Mairoa, Paemako, Tangitu, and Te Kuiti, which ridings form that portion of the old Waitomo County now included in the new Waitomo County; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of July in each and every year during a period equal to the currency of such loan, being a period of 36½ years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
