*Revoking the Limits of the Port of Waikokopu, and defining Others in lieu thereof.*

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 8, of the fifth day of February following, limits for the port or harbour of Waikokopu were defined:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said limits, and make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section six of the Harbours Act, 1923, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-recited Warrant of the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, and in lieu thereof doth hereby define the limits of the port or harbour of Waikokopu to be as follows:—

“All that area covered by the sea and by the tidal waters of the same, contained between the foreshore at high-water mark, ordinary spring tides, and a straight line drawn between the north-western extreme of Long Point on Mahia or Tera Kako Peninsula and the eastern extreme of the western entrance point of Nuhaka River.
