A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, has recommended that the lands described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and by section fifty-eight of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1919, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be scenic reserves under the first-mentioned Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the twenty-first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *Gazette* of the thirtieth day of June, then instant, setting apart settlement land for selection by discharged soldiers, under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, in so far as it relates to the land described in the Schedule hereto.
