THE TARANAKI TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Taranaki powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Taranaki Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of New Plymouth, and known as the Taranaki Jockey Club's Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.
