

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

SCHEDULE.

PART Pukenui 2D Section 1, comprising Sections 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15, Block XV, Te Kuiti Native Township: Area, 1 acre 1 rood 2 perches.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Government Railways Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations made under the said Act on the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, by omitting from Regulation 1 the words "Permanent Head" means the General Manager of Railways, or the member for the time being acting for or on his behalf," and substituting the following: "Permanent Head" means the Board of Management of the Department acting through the Chairman or any member thereof or other person authorized in that behalf by the said Board."

And, with the like advice and consent, and in further pursuance of the said power and authority, His Excellency the Governor-General of the said Dominion doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall be deemed to have come into operation on the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
