WITH reference to the notification published in the
New Zealand Gazette on 19th February, 1925, with
respect to the admission of goods to entry in New Zealand
under the British Preferential Tariff, it is hereby notified for public information that it has been decided to further postpone until 1st January, 1926, the date upon which the amended conditions to be decided upon shall take effect.

Those interested will therefore understand that until 31st December, 1925, goods will, in New Zealand, be admitted to entry under the British Preferential Tariff under the conditions heretofore existing and set out in the Customs l'egulations gazetted on 7th December, 1922.
