## A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 44, of the tenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, taking land for the purposes of a gravel-pit in Block X, Corwar Survey District, such land being no longer required for the purposes for which it was taken.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *Gazette* of the nineteenth day of that month (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"), certain portions of Provisional State Forest lands in the West-
