Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fees, &c., Otago Acclimatization District.

"N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, I, Richard Francis Bollard, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of May, 1926 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Otago Acclimatization District, as described in the First Schedule hereto, except in the areas referred to in condition No. 3 and in the Second Schedule referred to in condition No. 3 and in the Second Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game and native game—viz., mallard duck, Canadian goose, grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), and black swan; and the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of June, 1926 (both days inclusive) to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., Californian quail; and the period from the first day of May to the 7th day of May, 1926 (both days inclusive) to be an open season in the County of Vincent, being part of the said district for the taking and killing of the following native game—viz., paradise duck; and the period from the first day of May to the 31st day of May, 1926 (both days inclusive) to be an open season in the said dis-(both days inclusive) to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., pukeko; except in the Maniototo County, wherein the period for taking or killing pukeko will be from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of June, 1926 (both days inclusive); and the period from the 1st day of January to the 12th day of February, 1927 (both days inclusive) to be an open season for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., godwits; subject to the following conditions.

## CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such imported game and native game, including godwits, within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each, and licenses to take or kill such native game only, neluding godwits, will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings (10s.) each; and the secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. The number of such imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day shall not exceed twelve mallard duck, twenty-five head in all of grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), and black swan, six head of paradise duck; or a total of twenty-five for the seven days; twelve head of pukeko, except in the Maniototo County, wherein the number is unlimited; Californian quail, twenty head, except in the following districts, viz.: Waikaia, Heriot, Hindon, Maungatua, Waihola, Waipori, and Puerua, wherein the taking or killing of Californian quail is absolutely prohibited; and Canadian goose, of which latter not more than two head will be allowed to be taken or killed during the

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game 3. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits (or native game only, including godwits), shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game and native game (or native game only) on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or any land mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game.

4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such imported game or native game, with any automatic or auto loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only, or with any rifle or pea-rifle, o her than a shoulder-gun; and no gun shall use any gun o her than a shoulder-gun; and no gun shall be used for the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the known as No. 12 at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds 101b. in weight.

5. A license issued pursuant to this notification to take or

kill imported and native game or native game only shall entitle the holder thereof to take or kill native game in the Southland Acclimatization District, during the period and subject, mutatis mutandis, to the conditions prescribed in the notification fixing an open season for native game in that district.

6. Shooting may begin not earlier than half an hour before

sunrise and cease not later than half an hour after sunset.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.
