WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto has been duly set apart as a site for a post-office, being a purpose within Class II of the Second Schedule of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908:

And whereas it is expedient that such land should be appropriated for recreation purposes, being a purpose within Class III of the said Second Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the eleventh section of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, do by this notification declare that the said land shall, from and after the eighteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, be appropriated for recreation purposes under Class III of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908; and I do hereby direct that this notification shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District, containing by admeasurement 1 rood, more or less, being part of Section 79A, Town of Hector. Bounded towards the north-east by Greenfield Street, 204.2 links; towards the south-east by Pitt Street, 116.9 links; towards the south-west by a line parallel to the north-east boundary, 223.7 links; and towards the north-west by the road along the coast of Tasman Sea: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 5923/5, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington and thereon coloured red.
