REGULATIONS.

1. Every farmer, broker, merchant, owner of store, woollenmill proprietor, owner of meat-freezing works, owner of wool-scouring and fellmongering works, and every other person storing or who may store wool shall, upon request and within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish to the Statistician or to any person appointed by him in writing the particulars set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall sign the form and transmit it by post or otherwise to the Statistician or to the officer appointed by him in writing him in writing.

2. These regulations shall apply to all managers or agents of the persons enumerated in paragraph 1 above.
