Notice of Allocation of Wards to Producers' Representatives under the Dairy-produce Export Control Amendment Act, 1926.

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section four of the Dairy-produce Export Control Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that forthwith after the passing of that Act the Governor-General shall, by notice in the *Gazette*, allot in manner therein provided to the several producers' representatives then in office as members of the New Zealand Dairy-produce Control Board the several wards constituted by the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby allot to the several wards whose numbers appear in the first column of the Schedule hereto the respective representatives whose names appear opposite to the numbers of such wards in the second column of the said Schedule.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

And whereas a Commission appointed in pursuance of section two of the Town Boards Amendment Act, 1912, held an inquiry, and reported that the locality defined in the said petition was suitable for municipal control, and made certain alterations of the boundaries thereof:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, with boundaries as altered by the said Commission, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Putaruru Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

SCHEDULE.

PUTARURU TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the south-eastern corner of part Section 97 as shown on plan 13158 deposited in the office of the District

Land Registrar at Auckland; thence south-easterly generally along the Oraka Stream Reserve to the north-eastern corner of Section 101, Selwyn Settlement, Block VI, Patetere North Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of the said Section 101 to its southernmost corner; thence by a right line crossing a public road and the Auckland-Rotorua Railway to the north-western corner of Section 17, Selwyn Settlement, Block X, Patetere North Survey District; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of Lot 64 on plan 17362 deposited as aforesaid; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of said Lot 64 to the north-western corner of the said lot; thence by a line at right angles across Lichfield Road, and produced for a distance of $9\frac{1}{4}$ chains from the eastern side of the said Lichfield Road; thence north-westerly along a line parallel to Lichfield Road to Arapuni Road; thence across Arapuni Road and northerly along a line parallel to the south-western boundary of Lot 3 on plan 15603 deposited as aforesaid for a distance of 11 chains; thence north-easterly along a line at right angles to the aforesaid south-western boundary to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of Lot 2 on plan 15603 aforesaid; thence northerly along the north-eastern boundary of Lot 2 aforesaid to its northernmost corner; thence by a right line across Lot 5 on plan 15603 aforesaid to peg No. XXXIX on the north-western boundary

of the said Lot 5; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of the said Lot 5 to Overdale Road, across Overdale Road, the Auckland-Rotorua Railway, and Buckland Street; thence by a right line to a point being the intersection of the production of the western boundary of Lot 180 on plan 17973, deposited as aforesaid, and the production of the north-western boundaries of Lots 97, 98, and 99 on the said plan; thence to and along the north-western boundaries of the said Lots 97, 98, and 99, the north-western boundaries of Lots 96, 95, 94, 93, 92, and 91 on plan 13502, deposited as aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Lots 88, 87, and 86 and that boundary produced to the southern boundary of part Section 97, as shown on plan 13158 deposited as aforesaid; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the south-eastern corner of the said part Section 97, the place of commencement.
