“The Mount Eden Borough Council, being the local body having control of Hillside Crescent, hereby resolves that the portion of the street running north-west and south-east be exempted from the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908”; such portion of street being described in the Schedule hereto.
