THE following special order passed by the Mauriceville County Council at a special meeting held on 11th

September, 1926, and confirmed at an ordinary meeting held on 9th October, 1926, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Noxious Weeds Act.

SPECIAL ORDER.

THAT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, and the Noxious Weeds Amendment Act, 1923, the Mauriceville County Council hereby resolves and declares by way of special order that the plants mentioned in the First Schedule hereto (being plants mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, as extended from time to time by the Governor-General in Council) are not noxious weeds within the County of Mauriceville; and that the plants mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto (being plants mentioned in the Third Schedule of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, as extended from time to time by the Governor-General in Council) are noxious weeds within the said county; and also that all previous resolutions passed by the said Council declaring any plants whatsoever to be noxious weeds shall be and the same are hereby revoked.
