

society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

Section 39. Except as otherwise expressly provided, nothing in any license or other authority under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, shall entitle the holder thereof to enter upon any private land without the consent of the owner or occupier thereof, or upon any State forest or provisional State forest.

Ashburton ..	Grey duck black swan, paradise duck, and pukeko.
Auckland ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, black swan, pukeko, grey duck, and spoonbill duck.
Bay of Islands ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, pukeko, and black swan.
Buller ..	Hares and grey duck.
Coromandel ..	Cock pheasants, Californian quail, grey duck, black teal, and black swan.
East Coast ..	Cock pheasants, Virginian, Californian, and Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, and black swan.
Feilding and district	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, mallard duck, pukeko, and black swan.
Grey District ..	Hares, grey duck, and black swan.

Hawke's Bay ..	Cock pheasants, mallard duck, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, widgeon (or shoveller), and black swan.

Nelson ..	Californian quail and pukeko.
North Canterbury ..	Canadian goose, grey duck, mallard duck, spoonbill duck (or shoveller), black swan, pukeko, and paradise duck.
Opotiki ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, and black swan.
Otago ..	Californian quail, mallard duck, Canadian goose, grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), black swan, paradise duck, and pukeko.
Rotorua ..	Cock pheasants, Californian, Virginian, and Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, spoonbill duck, eastern golden plover, turnstone, and black swan.
South Canterbury ..	Mallard duck, grey duck, black teal, spoonbill duck, black swan, and paradise duck.
Southland ..	Grey duck, spoonbill duck, black swan, pukeko, and paradise duck.
Stratford ..	Cock pheasants, Californian quail, grey duck, black teal, pukeko, and black swan.
Taranaki ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, and black swan.
Tauranga ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, pukeko, and black swan.
Waipapu ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, and black teal.
Waimarino ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, and grey duck.

Wanganui ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, spoonbill duck (or shoveller), black teal, and black swan.
Wellington ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, mallard duck, hares, grey duck, shoveller, and black swan.
Westland ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, mallard duck, grey duck, black swan, pukeko, and paradise duck.
Whangarei ..	Cock pheasants, Californian and Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, pukeko, and black swan.

NOTE.—Not more than twenty-five head of native game may be killed by any one person in any one day in any district.

The period and the area within which imported and native game may be taken or killed is specified in the notification fixing the open season in each district.

Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before sunrise and must cease not later than one hour after sunset.

A short season for paradise duck from 2nd May to 8th May, 1927, and for pukeko from 2nd May to 31st May, 1927, has been granted in respect of some acclimatization districts, and from 2nd May to 30th June, 1927, in part of the Otago Acclimatization District. The issue of licenses to take or kill these birds is provided for in the Warrants fixing the open season in the districts concerned.

Native pigeon is absolutely protected.

GODWITS AND KNOTS.

Godwits may be taken or killed in the following districts during the period set opposite the name of each district respectively:—

Buller ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Coromandel ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Feilding and District	1st February to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Hawke's Bay ..	Close season.
Hobson ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Mangonui-Whangaroa	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Nelson ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Opotiki ..	1st February to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Otago ..	2nd January to 12th February, 1928 (both days inclusive).
South Canterbury ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Southland ..	1st February to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Tauranga ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Wellington ..	1st February to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).

And both godwits and knots may be taken or killed in the following districts during the period set opposite the name of each district respectively:—

Auckland ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
North Canterbury ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Rotorua ..	1st February to 30th April, 1928 (both days inclusive).
Whangarei ..	2nd January to 31st March, 1928 (both days inclusive).

The license fee for taking or killing these birds only is ten shillings (10s.): Provided that a license to take or kill imported and native game also authorizes the holder to take or kill godwits and knots in the districts where these birds may be taken or killed.
