A short season for paradise duck from 2nd May to 8th May, 1927, and for pukeko from 2nd May to 31st May, 1927, has been granted in respect of some acclimatization districts, and from 2nd May to 30th June, 1927, in part of the Otago Acclimatization District. The issue of licenses to take or kill these birds is provided for in the Warrants fixing the open season in the districts concerned.
