IT is hereby notified that for the purposes of the election of members of the General Council of Education representing the teachers in secondary and technical schools

Non-existence of Shoal north-eastward.

The master of the American schooner yacht "Fisherman" reports that at 8 a.m. on 7th December, 1926, his vessel sailed over the position of the shoal reported in the year 1900, about 35 miles north-east from Malden Island, in latitude 3° 40' S., longitude 154° 38' W., on H.O. Chart 824A. A good look-out was kept from the masthead, but no shoal or any obstruction was seen. Observations were very good and chronometer was checked by radio.
