Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces amended.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, 1927; and I do hereby declare that the amendment hereby made shall take effect as from date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SECTION IV.—NEW ZEALAND PERMANENT FORCES: ENLISTMENT,
PROMOTION, TRANSFER, AND DISCHARGE.
