And whereas the Featherston County Council has been authorized to borrow the sum of twelve thousand pounds for reconstructing and surfacing with bitumen certain portion of the Wellington-Napier Main Highway and the Featherston-Martinborough Main Highway, and is now desirous of borrowing an additional sum of one thousand two hundred pounds under the authority of section nineteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, for the purpose of completing the undertaking:

And whereas the Minister of Finance has given his precedent consent as required by the above-recited section one hundred and fourteen, and it is desired that the term for which the money may be borrowed be twenty years, and the rate of interest payable thereon be not exceeding six per centum per annum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the term for which the Featherston County Council may borrow the said sum of one thousand two hundred pounds shall be twenty years, and the rate of interest that may be paid thereon shall be a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, and the said Featherston County Council is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of one thousand two hundred pounds accordingly.
