THE following special order passed by the Manawatu County Council at a special meeting on the 14th day of February, 1928, and confirmed at a subsequent meeting held on the 13th day of March, 1928, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Noxious Weeds Act.

SPECIAL ORDER.

THAT in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, and amendments, and all other powers enabling, the Manawatu County Council, by way of special order, hereby resolves as follows: That the undermentioned plant, included in the Third Schedule of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, shall be deemed to be a noxious weed within the County of Manawatu:—

Lupin (*Lupinus luteus*).

on the working-day immediately preceding any day generally observed in the Borough of Palmerston North as a whole holiday.

The notice dated the 12th February, 1908, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th February, 1908, fixing closing-hours of tobacconists' shops in the said borough shall be and is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.

Prohibition of Issue of Money-order and Transmission of Postal Correspondence in New Zealand for the Great Royal Hungarian Money Lottery, Budapest.

THE Postmaster-General of the Dominion of New Zealand having reasonable ground for supposing that the institution whose name and address are shown in the Schedule hereunder is engaged in promoting or carrying out a lottery or scheme of chance, it is hereby ordered, under section 28 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, that no money-order in favour of the said institution, or any officer thereof, shall be issued, and that no postal packet addressed to the said institution, or any officer thereof (either by its own or any fictitious or assumed name), or addressed to the address in the Schedule hereunder without a name, shall be either registered or forwarded by the Post Office of New Zealand.
