(a) "The Wellington City Council, being the local authority having control of all streets in the City of Wellington, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to that portion of the street, being the approach to the Northland Tunnel, extending along the frontages thereto of Lots 1 and 3, D.P. 8618, City of Wellington";

(b) "The Wellington City Council, being the local authority having control of all streets in the City of Wellington, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to that portion of the street, being the approach to the Northland Tunnel, extending from the tunnel to its junction with Putnam Street and adjoining Lots 1, 2, and 3, D.P. 8618, and Lot 16, D.P. 8619, City of Wellington";

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the portion of street or street (described in the Schedule hereto), within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said streets.
