23. INLAND commercial papers or printed papers from two or more persons or firms or which, in the opinion of the Postmaster, have the appearance of having emanated from two or more persons or firms, shall not be enclosed in the one cover or envelope. Any packet found to infringe this regulation shall be surcharged double the difference between the amount of postage payable if the matter relating to the several persons or firms had been posted separately and the amount of postage affixed to the packet.

Bounded towards the north and east generally by Holdsworth Street, by Sections Nos. 3, 2, 1, 6, 8, 10, 12, and 14, by Grey Street, by Section No. 70, again by Grey Street, by Featherston Street, and again by Grey Street; and towards the south and west generally by the Te Hoe River.

Also all that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 100 acres, more or less, being Section No. 201, Block XII, Mangaone Survey District. SCHEDULE.

CLAUSE 28 of the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916, as set out in an Order in Council dated the 1st day of February, 1921, and published in the *Gazette* of the 17th day of the same month, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "not exceeding in any case one year" the words "in the case of the Cook Islands Account, and not exceeding three years in the case of the Niue Island Account."
