A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the thirteenth day of November, then instant, setting apart settlement lands for selection by discharged soldiers under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, in so far as it relates to the lands in the Schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Forests Act, 1921-22, and pursuant to a resolution in that behalf passed by both Houses of Parliament, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke (so far only as it relates to the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto) the Proclamation of the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, whereby the said land (with certain other land) was set apart as a permanent State Forest, and declare that the reservation thereby effected is (so far only as aforesaid) revoked accordingly.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.—AUCKLAND FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 10 acres 0 roods 72 perches, more or less, being part Allotment 410, Whangamarino Parish, situated in Block XV, Maramarua Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north by a road and Sections 48, 49, 50, 51, and 52, Te Kauwhata Township; towards the east and south by State Forest No. 33, *Gazette*, 1886, page 1497, 709-7 links and 1362-4 links respectively, and towards the west by the North Island Main Trunk Railway, 810-4 links.
