for a Military Reserve

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth sec-tion of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time set apart temporarily as reserves, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned.

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-sixtieth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily re-served under the said three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section served under the said three-hundred-and-inty-finite section may, at the expiration of one month, but not later than six months, after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the Gazette ·

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was, by Warrant dated the seventeenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in *Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of that month, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for a military reserve.

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursu-ance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for a military reserve for which the said land was so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 3 roods 14 perches, more or less, being originally part of the land known as the Military Reserve, situate at Point Dorset, in Block VII, Port Nichol-son Survey District, and bounded as follows: Commencing at a point on the north-western boundary of the said Military Reserve 310.69 links south of the northernmost corner of the said reserve; thence by a line bearing 198° 36' 30", being the south-eastern side of Hector Street, 606.06 links; thence by a line bearing 108° 36' 30", 303.03 links; thence by a line bearing 18° 36' 30", 606.06 links; and thence by a line bearing 288° 36' 30" 303.03 links, to the point of com-mencement: Be all the aforesaid linkages and bearings a little more or less. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan numbered 39/46, deposited in the Wellington District Office, Department of Lands and Survey, and thereon coloured yellow. ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing vellow.

I N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the scenic reserve described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved when the science is the Governor Beneral of Chemical Science in the Science is the the Science under the said Act) in the Taumarunui Borough Council, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to

1. The period for which the control of the reserve is hereby vested shall be three years from the date hereof, unless the reservation is previously altered or revoked under the said Act.

2. The said Council shall prepare a report each year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of receipts and expenditure in connection with the said reserve.

Such report and statement shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the said Act as soon as possible after the close of the year.

3. The said Council shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
