IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Auckland City Council on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, viz. :—

“That the Auckland City Council, being the local authority having control of the streets in the City of Auckland, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to that portion of Federal Street adjoining Lots 1 and 5 of Allotment 11, Section 22, City of Auckland”; such portion of street being described in the Schedule hereto.
