A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intitled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and all buildings and enclosures used or occupied thereon, shall, from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison known as the Horopito Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 4 acres 3 roods 16.2 perches, more or less, being a portion of part Section 2, situated in Block XVI, Manganui Survey District, Waimarino County.
