PURSUANT to section 13 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, I hereby give notice that at a poll of the rate-payers of the Borough of Devonport taken on the 1st day of May, 1929, on the proposals of the Devonport Borough Council to borrow the sums of £4,300 and £1,900 for the undermentioned purposes the result was as follows:—

Proposal No. 1.—Land Compensation: £4,300 (four thousand three hundred pounds) for the purpose of repaying to the General Account moneys paid out of the said account for compensation-moneys and other expenses in connection with the taking of land under the Public Works Act, 1908, for—

- (a) Street-widening purposes (Victoria Road); and
