And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by section one hundred and thirty-one of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act"), and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that the New Lynn Borough Council shall defray all the costs of the Commission appointed under the said Act by His Excellency the Governor-General on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, in connection with the proposal to constitute the Borough of New Lynn, and with the like advice and consent doth hereby also direct that the said New Lynn Borough Council shall defray all the costs of the poll taken under the said Act on the thirteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, in connection with the proposal to constitute the said borough.
