In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 15th day of July, 1929, to the 15th day of August, 1929 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Rotorua Acclimatization District for the taking or killing of the following imported game viz., Sambur deer stags and hinds—with-in that part of the said acclimatization district described in the First Schedule hereto, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill Sambur deer stags and hinds may be issued by the District Manager, Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, at Rotorua, on payment of a license fee of £2, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification: Provided that not more than one such licenses shall be issued to the same person. The number of such licenses shall not exceed ten, and if the applications exceed the number of available licenses, then the persons exceed the number of available licenses, then the persons to whom such licenses are to be issued shall be decided by

ballot.

2. No licensee shall take or kill more than two Sambur deer stags, and one hind. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.

3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, published in the New Zealand Gazette of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the District Manager, Department of Tourist and Health Resorts at Rotorua, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.
