A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land which is described in the Schedule hereto—and which was taken for a further portion of the Greymouth-Hokitika Railway, Kapitea Section, and is not now required for such purpose—shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a road, and that such road shall be maintained by the Westland County Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said council.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land dealt with : 3 roods 3 perches.

Being Railway land (Westland R.D.).

Situated in Block III, Waimea Survey District. (S.O. 2759.)
