AMENDED BY-LAWS OF THE NEW PLYMOUTH FIRE BOARD. BY-LAW No. 3, in respect of fires outside the Borough of New Plymouth, made on the 24th day of September, 1915, is hereby revoked and the following by-law is made in place

thereof:—
3. The Superintendent may, by his own discretion, render any assistance he deems necessary at any fire taking place outside the borough, provided always that he can do so without endangering the safety of the New Plymouth Fire District. If any portion of the New Plymouth Fire Brigade established and maintained by the Board attends and performs any services at a fire outside the Borough of New Plymouth at the request of the owner or occupier of such property, then such owner or occupier of such property, then such owner or occupier of such property shall pay to the Board for such attendance and services at the undermentioned rates:—

By-law No. 4, in respect of fires on board any ship or vessel, made on the 24th day of September, 1915, is hereby revoked and the following by-law is made in place thereof:—

If any brigade or any portion of the brigade, established and maintained by the Board, attends and performs any services at a fire taking place on board any ship or vessel, then the owner of such ship or vessel shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service the undermentioned rates as fixed by the Board, not exceeding—
