W HEREAS William McArley, of Wellington, is exclusively engaged as General Secretary of the New Zealand Locomotive Engine-drivers, Firemen, and Cleaners' Association:

And whereas prior to being engaged as aforesaid the said William McArley was in the service of the New Zealand Government Railways Department, and in respect of such service was a contributor to the Government Railways Superannuation Fund :

Superannuation Fund: And whereas the period of engagement of the said William McArley as General Secretary of the Association has been continuous with his aforementioned period of service in the Government Railways Department: And whereas the rate of contribution paid by the said William McArley to the Government Railways Superannua-tion Europeriod when a contributor theoret in respect of his foresaid
