Notice under the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its Amendment, fixing the Closing-hours of Fruiterers' Shops within the Combined District of Wellington.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the fruiterers' shops within the Combined District of Wellington, comprising the City of Wellington and the Town District of Johnsonville, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops within the said combined district be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: During the period from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September (both days inclusive) in each year on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 8 p.m., with the following exception—on the evening preceding Good Friday, and on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding the 3rd June, and on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Anzac Day there shall be no fixed closing-hour.

And whereas, I, Sydney George Smith, Minister of Labour, am satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said combined district:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 32 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, I do hereby direct that on and after the 9th day of June, 1930, all the said shops within the said combined district shall be closed accordingly.
