*Authorizing the Laying-off of Roads of less Width than 66 ft.*

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Minister of Lands, it is inexpedient, by reason of the fact that the land shown upon the plan of Town of Taita Extension No. 4, affecting part Section 59, Hutt Registration District, in Block IX, Belmont Survey District, is intended to be used wholly for residential purposes, that Cooper Street, Harding Square, Riverside Avenue, Harris, Harding, and Harbury Streets shown therein should be of the width of 66 ft.

Now, therefore, I, Ethelbert Alfred Ransom, Minister of Lands, do hereby, in pursuance of the power conferred upon me by section 17, subsection (1), of the Land Act, 1924, and of every other power me thereunto enabling, authorize the laying-off of Cooper Street of a width of not less than 30 ft., Harding Square of a width of not less than 40 ft., and Riverside Avenue, Harris, Harding, and Harbury Streets of a width of not less than 50 ft.: Provided always that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect or cause to be erected any building at a less distance than 33 ft. from the middle of such road.
