

A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

SCHEDULE.

HAE HAE TE MOANA SCENIC RESERVES.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 86 acres, more or less, being Reserve 3883 (in red), (Four Peaks Settlement), situated in Block XV, Four Peaks Survey District. Commencing at the south-eastern corner of Reserve 3884; thence bounded towards the east by Sections 4 and 6 by lines aggregating 4216.7 links; towards the south-west and south generally by the Hae Hae Te Moana River; towards the south-west and north-west by Section 1A, 1337.7 links and 1817.2 links respectively; and again towards the north-west by Reserve 3884, 2662.3 links, to the point of commencement: Be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 388/30A, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Also all that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 41 acres 0 roods 5 perches, more or less, being Reserve 3884 (in red), (Four Peaks Settlement), situated in Block XV, Four Peaks Survey District. Commencing at the north-western corner of Section 4, bounded thence towards the north-east and south-east by that section, 754.3 links and 938.1 links respectively; again towards the south-east by Reserve 3883, 2662.3 links; towards the north-west by part of Section 1, 3081.3 links; again towards the north-east generally by the road-line, 1218.7 links and 232.9 links, to the point of commencement: Be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 388/30B, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.
