I N pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that on and from the date hereof deer shall cease to be included in the Second Schedule of the said Act with respect to the Wanganui Acclimatization District described in the Schedule hereto.
