EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE NAPIER BOROUGH COUNCIL, AT A MEETING OF SUCH COUNCIL HELD ON THE 1ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1930.

Resolution making Special Rate as Security for Special Loan of £13,300.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Napier Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges on a loan of £13,300, authorized to be raised by the Napier Borough Council by a poll of ratepayers taken on the 21st day of May, 1930, under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of—

Permanently constructing with bitumen paving the portions hereinafter mentioned of the following streets, namely:—

George's Drive from Marine Parade South to Hyderabad Road;

Marine Parade from Coote Road to northern side of the Municipal Baths;

Marine Parade from its junction with Emerson Street to its junction with Raffles Street;

Shakespeare Road from Post-office to Clyde Road;

Extract from the Minutes of Proceedings of the Franklin County Council at a Meeting of such Council held on the 25th day of August, 1930.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Franklin County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges on a loan of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250), authorized to be raised by the Franklin County Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of shelling 20 chains of Boundary Road and 20 chains of Cook's Road (Waipipi), the said Franklin County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of eleven-sixteenths (11/16ths) of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property of the Boundary
