A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was, by an order of the Native Land Court made on the twentieth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, duly laid off as a road-line, in pursuance of sections forty-nine and fifty of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that it is in the public interest that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the said Act:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-line as a public road has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by sections forty-nine and fifty of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and in so far

as each of these sections is applicable, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road-line described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE areas of the pieces of land proclaimed as a road:—

1 1 16	Tapatahi Block; coloured blue.
0 0 1·2	Ruatoki Ia No. 6 Block; coloured yellow.

Situated in Block VI, Waimana Survey District. (Plan 12962, red.)

In the Auckland Land District; as the same are more particularly delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 16/1784, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, under No. 2424, and thereon coloured as above mentioned.
