SPECIAL ORDER.

THAT in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it by section 5 (c) of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1928, and of all other Acts and powers (if any) it in that behalf enabling, the Lower Hutt Borough Council hereby resolves by way of special order:—

That the following plants be and are hereby declared to be noxious weeds within the meaning of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1928:—

Broom, fennel, gorse, and hemlock.
